An Israeli girl whose death brought fierce cries for vengeance against Arabs was not stoned to death, but **killed by a bullet from the rifle of a Jewish settler guarding her**, the army said today. Senior army commanders said they believed that the guard **fired the fatal shot in panic**.

The army Chief of Staff, Gen. Dan Shomron, told Israeli radio tonight that the incident Wednesday in the **West Bank village of Beita**, in which **two Palestinians were also killed**, had been a result of a "misunderstanding."

Earlier in the day, the army said the autopsy showed that the Israeli girl, Tirza Porat, had **died of a gunshot wound to the head** and said the bullet came from an **M-16 rifle, the weapon** carried by the guard. Army Destroys More Houses

Nevertheless, the **army blew up eight more houses in Beita today**, making a total of 14 destroyed over accusations that family members took part in the clash. On Thursday Israeli troops combing the hills **shot and killed a Palestinian youth**. The army said he was running away.

Miss Porat, 15 years old, was on a Passover holiday outing with 16 other teen-age Jewish settlers and two older armed guards when the clash occurred. Initially her death was luridly reported here as a stoning by Palestinian villagers, heightening the bitter tensions of four months of Palestinian protest against Israeli occupation of the West Bank and Gaza Strip. The state television and newspapers displayed gruesome pictures of her bloodied body on a street in the Palestinian village of Beita. 'God Will Avenge Her Blood'

"The heart of the entire nation is boiling," Prime Minister Yitzhak Shamir told thousands of angry Jewish settlers who gathered at her funeral, many of them with automatic rifles or submachine guns slung over their shoulders, or pistols at their hips. "God will avenge her blood."

Immediately after the first reports of the incident, the Justice Minister called for the **demolition of dozens of Arab homes and the expulsion of hundreds of Palestinians**, and the Religion Minister called for smashing "the skull of the viper of death."

Right-wing politicians, including Trade Minister Ariel Sharon and Rabbi Meir Kahane, founder of the Jewish Defense League, flocked to the funeral, and Rabbi Chaim

Israel today **expelled eight Arabs accused of leading the Palestinian uprising**, including six men suspected of involvement in an **attack on a group of Israeli hikers that left a Jewish teen-ager and two Palestinians dead**.

The expulsions brought to 20 the number of Palestinians deported to southern Lebanon since anti-Israel rioting erupted in the West Bank and Gaza nearly five months ago. Security sources have told United Press International that dozens more will be expelled if the unrest does not end by summer.

Six of the men were residents of the West Bank village of **Beita**, where an **Israeli teen-age girl and two Palestinians** were killed April 6 during a clash between **rock-throwing villagers** and a **group of Israeli youths** and **two adult guards** on a Passover holiday hike.

The army determined that the girl, Tirza Porat, 15, was killed by a **stray bullet fired from the M-16 automatic rifle carried by one of her escorts**. But the military has arrested more than 30 people, demolished 14 houses and destroyed acres of olive trees to punish residents for taking part in the stoning of the hikers.

Douglass-O'Connell Summer Global Internship – Dublin

- Fully funded CIEE program, including airfare and stipend for 8-week internship in Dublin, Ireland
- Intern in an Irish organization or company related to your field of interest
- Open to freshmen, sophomore, and juniors
- Must have a minimum GPA of 3.0 and demonstrate financial need
- Automatic \$1,500 grants for other CIEE programs for ALL qualified applicants not selected
- Letter of recommendation and 3-4 minute personal video are required to apply
- Application deadline = January 09, 2026

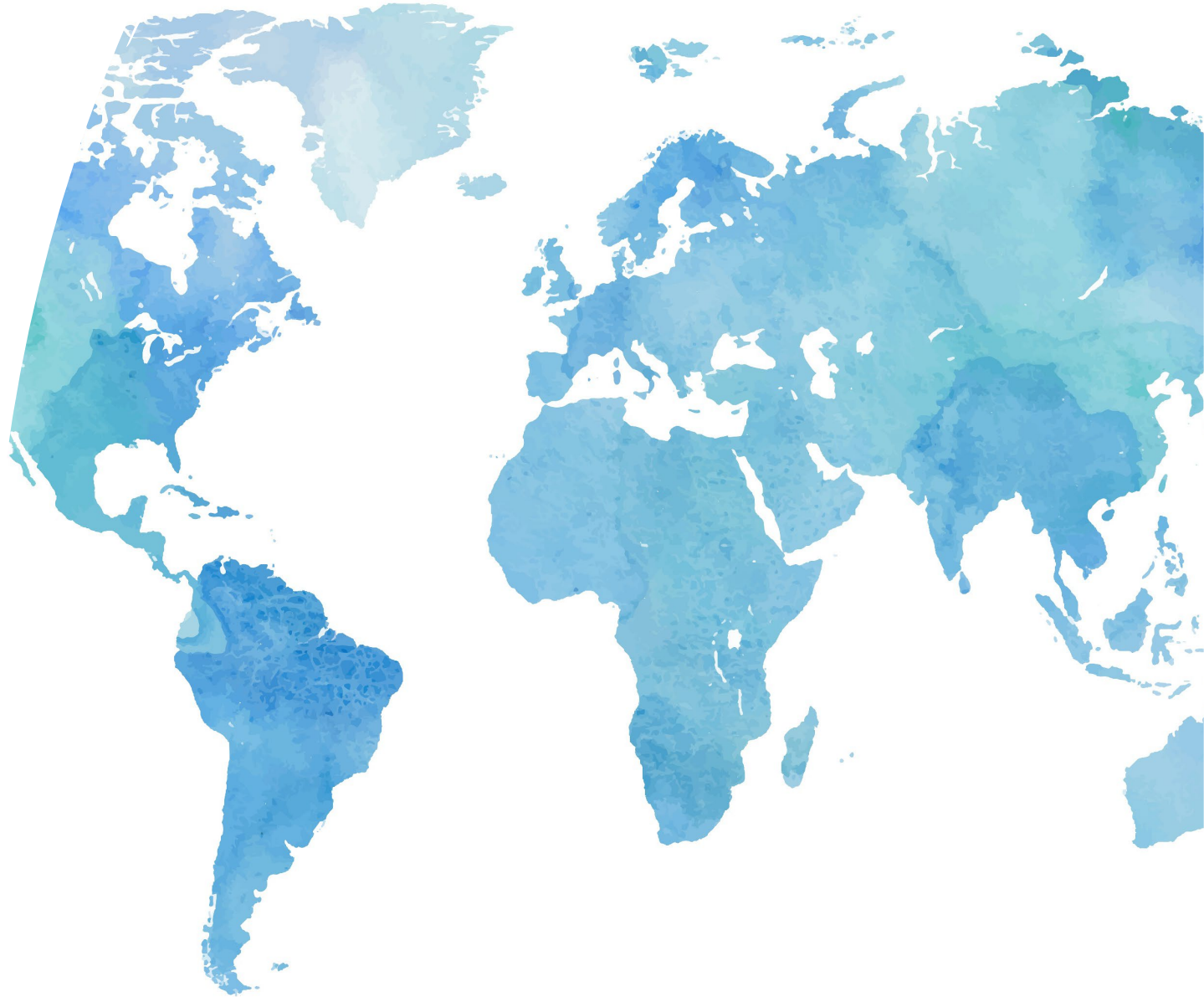
